 - For Q4 of your junior year, had not more than 14 periods absent & no unexcused absences
 - Achieved 2nd Honor Roll or higher for Semester 2 of your junior year

Level 1 Rewards:

- 1. Exempt from semester 1 and 2 exams in areas in which you achieved a level of Proficient or <u>Distinguished on the ACT or SAT</u>, including one related course* if the student does not have a core course (Reading/Writing, Math or Science) in that category.¹
- 2. Choice of parking spot and free parking tag (\$5.00 deposit still applies).
- 3. 8 Exclusive Rewards Qualifier Open Campus Lunch privilege dates starting in September (dates determined by the Administration and may be subject to change. Tentative dates: 9/23, 11/18, 12/9, 1/20, 2/10, 3/10, 3/31, 4/28

Level 2 – Qualification Requirements:

- Hit three out of four ACT benchmarks, OR
- Scored in the 50th percentile or higher on 2 out of 3 of the SAT test categories of Math, Reading, or Writing, OR
- Scored a 3 or higher on an AP Exam in your junior year, and
 - For Q4 of your junior year, had no disciplinary referrals or warnings
 - For Q4 of your junior year, had not more than 15 21 periods absent & no unexcused absences
 - Achieved a cumulative GPA of 3.00 by the end of your junior year
